NOTICE TO CONTRIBUTORS

All secretarial work in typing, duplicating and despatching this journal devolves upon the Editor, who will be greatly assisted if contributors note the following conventions. In addition, contributors of longer papers should submit their work typed in the format of the BULLETIN onto stencils, after consultation with the Editor.

Contributions should be typed in 1½ spacing and submitted in duplicate. Dates should be written in full, e. g. 1st October, 1966, or, in tables, in the abbreviated form 1. x. 66. Localities are to be given a grid reference, except in the cases of Provinces, larger cities and better known rivers etc. Both English and scientific names must be given at first mention; thereafter, and in tabulations or papers of a check-list nature, either English or scientific names may be adopted. Scientific names must be underlined, and trinomials should be used only when required for discussion. Nomenclature should follow Bannerman, The Birds of West and Equatorial Africa, 1953, unless reasons for departure from this work are given. References may be given in shortened form in the text, e. g. Elgood (1964, Bull. Niger. Orn. Soc. 1 (1): 13-25), or in full as a terminal list under the heading 'References', e. g.
