BIRD RINGING IN NIGERIA, 1964. SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

During 1964 there was a further large increase in the number and variety of birds ringed. Two Cetti's Warblers Cettia cetti ringed in Kano and two Ortolan Buntings Emberiza hortulana in Vom are newly-ringed species in West Africa, the former being the first recorded occurrence and the latter virtually so in West Africa..

A total of 2,071 Yellow Wagtails Budytus flavus were ringed by V.W. Smith and his team at Vom. Considerably more could have been marked if

rings had not run out in January. The Kano roost was used until February when the area dried out, when the birds moved to another marsh three miles away. This marsh also proved to be good for migrant Reed and Sedge Warblers Acrocephalus scirpaceus and schoenobaenus in April, 34 and 61 being ringed respectively.

The autumn passage through Kano produced more Nightingales Luscinia megarhynchos but fewer Garden Warblers Sylvia borin than usual. One European Scops Owl Otus scops and one Blackcap Sylvia atricapilla were caught.

The spring passage through Vom was very productive and 172 birds were ringed including 9 Icterine Warblers Hippolais icterina, 2 Ortolan Buntings, a Rock Thrush Monticola saxatilis and a Scops Owl. The autumn passage was rather poor compared with the previous year; 78 birds were ringed including two Blackcaps.

I ringed 76 Ruff Philomachus pugnax in three visits to a lake near Kano in March; apart from this very few waders were ringed.

In the spring of 1964 a Spanish Wheatear Oenanthe hispanica was seen frequently on the implement park of the Agricultural Dept. Farm in Kano. What was presumably the same bird returned in the autumn and I ringed it. A Sedge Warbler ringed in Kano on 2nd April 1963 was recaptured in the same place on 4th March 1964. A Redstart Phoenicurus phoenicurus ringed in Kano on 23rd October 1963 was recaptured there on 29th October 1964.

Recoveries of Nigerian-ringed birds are shown in Schedule I. One Yellow Wagtail has now been recovered in Poland, 6 in Italy (all on the Adriatic coast), 2 in Malta, one in Algeria and one in Tunisia.

A Whimbrel ringed in Kent, England on 25th August 1961 was recovered near Lagos on 22nd May 1962, and 2 Swallows Hirundo rustica caught at Uzere, Eastern Nigeria, on 7th October 1964 had been ringed at Rheindorf, Germany, on 4th June 1964 and Fairburn, Yorks, England, on 6th September 1963. *

Schedule II summarises birds ringed during the year. Yellow Wagtails have been classified as 'flavus' except in the few cases where a male could be identified more exactly. A male flavus wagtail ringed in Kano on 2nd April 1964 appeared to be of the race B.f.superciliaris. In Kano 76 flavus wagtails were recaptured during the year, 32 recaptured from the previous season, 12 from 2 years ago, and 3 from three years ago. Two Snowy-crowned Robin-Chats Cossypha nivalis capilla were ringed in 1963 and both were retrapped one year later in the same place.

One of the two Olivaceous Warblers Hippolais pallida ringed in Kano was a larger and greyer bird with a longer bill and probably belonged to the race H.p.opaca.

A WEEK AT BOKKOS

Bokkos ($9^{\circ} 20' N.$, $9^{\circ} 00' E.$) lies at the southern end of the Jos Plateau, at an altitude of just over 4,000 ft. Although within the area covered by the 'Provisional Check-list of the Birds of the Plateau Province over 3,000 feet' (Ebbutt et al., Bull. N.O.S. 1964) these notes may be of interest because they were made during one week (27th September to 4th October, 1964) at a time when there was a considerable movement of migrants. Breeding notes on some of the species have also been included.

The countryside is open grassland, favoured by the Fulani for grazing their cattle; rocky outcrops predominate. The main areas covered were approximately two miles radius of Bokkos and Daffo (11 miles West), and the road between these two villages.

White-faced Whistling Duck *Dendrocygna viduata*. Brood of half-grown ducklings on river.

Harriers *Circus* sp. None seen.

Bush Fowl *Francolinus bicalcaratus*. One killed contained a shelled egg.

Black-bellied Bustard *Lissotis melanogaster*. One female seen; from its anxious behaviour, it seemed to have a nest or young nearby.

Common Sandpiper *Actitis hypoleucus*. Few seen on river.
