BIRD RINGING IN NIGERIA, 1965

EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT

During 1965 once more a record number of birds - 5096 - were ringed. It is not likely that more records will continue in future because our most enthusiastic ringer, Mr V.W.Smith, left Nigeria in March 1966*.

Most of the birds ringed were Yellow Wagtails <u>Budytes flavus</u> (in Vom 2511 and in Kano 1441). It is significant that although 107 birds were recaught in Vom from the same or previous seasons and in Kano there were 170 recaptures, not one Vom-ringed bird was caught in Kano and no Kano birds were caught in Vom. Three wagtails were recaught in Kano just over four years since they were first ringed.

Recoveries from abroad are shown in Schedule II. One wagtail was recovered west of Nigeria in Morocco, and there were several recoveries considerably east of north of Nigeria: two in Rissia, one in Greece and one in Turkey. The wagtail no. 23887 is the most northerly recovery to date, and had travelled at least 4500 miles to near Leningrad.

There are three instances of wagtails ringed abroad being • recovered in Nigeria. One was a bird ringed in Sweden in 1952, and the others were from Russia and Italy.

Several more recaptures of other migrants in subsequent seasons were reported, as shown in Schedule III. The male Black-eared Wheatear returned to the Agricultural Department Farm in Kano for the third successive year. A Whitethroat Sylvia communis retrapped eleven months after it was originally ringed, at Nguru, was the only one which I ringed that year.

Dr A.J.Hopson ringed a number of Sand Martins Riparia riparia and warblers at Malam fatori on the western shore of Lake Chad in the spring of 1965, thus showing the potentialities of the Chad area.

NOTES ON A MIXED CORMORANT AND HERON BREEDING

COLONY NEAR MALAMFATORI (LAKE CHAD)

To the west and south of Malamfatori (13° 40' N, 12° 25' E) a large area or marshland is flooded each year from November to June by the rising waters of the River Yobe and Lake Chad. The floods reach a peak in January, and then the waters begin to recede until most of the marsh is dried out by June. During the winter of 1963-64, a large breeding colony of cormorants, darters, herons and ibises was discovered in the centre of this area of marsh.
