## ADDITIONS TO LOCAL AVIFAUNAS

Topo Island. I have made two visits to Topo Island from 24th to 27th April 1964 and from 23rd to 25th October 1964. During these visits I have recorded a number of species not mentioned by Button or Fry (Bull. N.O.S. 2 5-8). I should point out that the part of Topo I visited is not identical with the area covered by Button, but extends a further mile or so to the East beyond the 'assemblage of buildings' which, incidentally, includes a non-catering rest-house. It the extreme easterned of this area is a small patch of forest bordering on the lagoon.

The following species appeared to be fairly common and were frequently seen during both visits:

Cameroptera brevicaudata Grey-backed Cameroptera
Onychognathus fulgidus Chestnut-winged Starling
Lanius collaris Fiscal Shrike

Several individuals of <u>L. collaris</u> seem to frequent the area to the East of the cattle enclosure - about a mile to the East of the resthouse, but were not observed elsewhere.

The following species were only recorded on one occasion, although in most cases more than one individual was seen:

Mesopicos goertae Grey Woodpecker (April)
Viango australis Green Fruit-Pigeon (April)
Scotornis climacurus Long-tailed Nightjar (April)
Estrilda melpoda Orange-cheeked Waxbill (April)
Lamprocolius purpureus Purple Glossy Starling (April)
Hyphanturgus brachypterus Spectacled Weaver (April)
Muscicapa striata Spotted Flycatcher (24-25.x.1964)

Button refers to the fact that several dry-season visitors remain at Topo later than they do on the mainland at Ilaro 45 miles to the North. A flock of 20-30 Cattle Egrets <u>Bubulcus ibis</u> were still at Topo on 27th April 1964 and a similar flock had arrived by 24th October 1964. Several individuals of the Blue-headed Wagtail <u>Budytes flavus flavus</u> were also recorded as late as 26th April 1964. Quite a large number of White-throated Bee-eaters <u>Aërops albicollis</u> were recorded as both the April and October visits.

Malamfatori, Lake Chad. Four additional species of birds have been observed in the Malamfatori area since January (Bull. N.O.S. 4: 7-15).

Nyroca nyroca Ferruginous Duck - flocks of up to about 150 seen frequently in flight over the marshes during January, February and March, 1965.

Porzana porzana Spotted Crake - one in thick reed beds on the lake shore on 15th March 1965. Streaked upper parts, dark vertical stripes on the flanks, pale yellowish-buff undertail coverts and bright orange-red at the base of the bill were all clearly seen. (This species is not given in Bannerman, but is given as 'rere' in Elgood's Provisional check-list of the birds of Niger: a, Bull. N.O.S. 1 p.16; the combination of plumage features mentioned, particularly undertail coverts
