5th September. Grey Phalarope, Wilson's Petrel, Sandwich Tern.

6th September. Freetown from 0900 hrs to 1230 hrs. The hills above the town were visited; they consist of mature secondary growth with cultivated clearings along the streams; the avifauna apparently bears a close similarity to that at Ilaro (Western Nigeria) with two exceptions - Hooded Vultures and Crimson Seed-crackers Pyrenestes sanguineus (coccineus) were seen at Freetown.

In Freetown Harbour: Wilson's Petrel, Whimbrel, Black Tern, Royal Tern, Sandwich Tern and Grey Phalarone.

7th September. Wilson's Petrel at stern, and 4 Sandwich Terns.

8th September. Pomarhine Ekua, Black Tern and Wilson's Petrel.

9th September. Ship docked at Tamo harbour, and we paid a visit to Sekume Lagoon 4 miles to the West, from 1030 to 1230 hrs. This is a shallow brackish lagoon on the Accra Plain savannah. Birds recorded:

# ADDITIONS TO LOCAL AVIPAUNAS

Ilaro. A number of additional species have been observed at Ilaro, Western Region, since the account given in Bull. N.O.S.1(1964, p.5-7). Further work since September 1964, when I returned from Leave, necessitates a reassessment of the status of some of the birds appearing in the original list.

## Status re-assessments:

Gymnogenys typicus W. fr. Harrier-Hawk Frequent all year round. Corythornis leucogaster White-bellied Kingfisher Rare, Ipake. Halcyon leucocephala Grey-headed Kingfisher Occasional, dry season. Lophoceros camurus Red-billed Dwarf Hornbill Frequent. Illadopsis rufescens Rufous-winged Akalat Delete - most definitely I.rufipennis.

Saxicola rubetra Whinchat Frequent, dry season 1964/5. /season. Campephaga phoenicoa Red-shouldered Cuckoo-Shrike Occasional, dry Chaunonotus sabini Sabine's Puff-backed Shrike Frequent.

Malamfatori, Lake Chad. Five additional species have been observed in the Malamfatori area since April, 1965 (see Bull. N.O.S. #: 7-15 & 5: 18-19). These are:

Leucopolius marginatus White-fronted Sand-Plover - up to 5 on the sandy shores of Lake Chad near Malamfatori between 26th May and 4th June 1965.

Arenaria interpres Turnstone - one flying northwards up the lake shore on 1st January 1965.

Phyllolais pulchella Acacia Warbler - about 4 in Acacia nilotica woodland on the banks of the Komodougu Yobe near Yo. We have also seen this species on several occasions in  $\Lambda$ . raddiana woodland near Kukawa and in  $\Lambda$ . sayel near Maiduguri. P. pulchella appears to be thinly but widely distributed in suitable habitats throughout the Sudan and Sahel savannahs of North-East Bornu. It may be of interest to add that the focus of distribution of this species lies to the East in the Sudan and Abyssinia and that Bornu apparently lies to the extreme West of its range.

Dicruruw adsimilia Glossy-backed Drongo - one in Acacia raddiana bush near Arege on 14th May 1965. D. adsimilia has been seen regularly in the more wooded portions of the Sahel savannah between Kukawa and Arege. It has been observed at all seasons of the year and is probably resident. The present record is the furthest North that we have seen the species in Bornu and the first time it has appeared in the Malamfatori area which is 13° 30' N. and probably lies at the extreme northern limit of its range.
